As scientists, we will study the following:

Unit: Uses of everyday materials

Identify and compare the suitability of everyday materials.

Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by bending, twisting and stretching.

Unit: Netball - Finding space, receiving and passing the ball.

Unit: Tennis - Forehand, backhand, serving, hitting the ball to a partner.

Unit: Football - Pass, receive and shoot the ball.
