Some of our 'Boxes of Love' will be gifted to the elderly of the parish at the Seniors Christmas Party on Saturday 10th December.


We would like as many boxes as possible in school by Friday 9th December so that we can bring lots of happiness to them all.


Please remember:




Date for your diary: SJF Carol Service Monday 12th December at St John Fisher Church 6pm.
