Message from Kate Blom, Chair of Governors

This academic year has been a busy one for the school, we've had a successful Ofsted inspection which is a credit to the hard work by staff and pupils and the support of our parents and carers. From a governance perspective there has been a lot of work and focus on the proposed formation of the Sancta Familia CAT and also on the financial state of the school. Unfortunately like all schools SJF is suffering from financial strain and we are relying more on the additional funds generated from our extended services offering and from donations by families via the PTFA and the Governors' Fund.

I have included an update from the Chairs of each of our main committees below which I hope helps to outline the work the

governing body does to both support and scrutinise Ms Kenna and her leadership team. Our committees focus on ensuring we deliver high quality education, but at the same time continuing to ensure the school is kept within budget.

The Governors would also like to thank the PTFA and especially the outgoing committee members who have done another fantastic job this year providing significant contributions to our school. These additional funds provide valuable support to the provision of the excellent educational facilities at SJF.

Sadly our vice-chair Mrs Therese Lord has decided to move on from the governing body, Therese has been a governor for over 10 years and her commitment, wise counsel and support to the school will be greatly missed.

On behalf of the Governing Board at SJF I would like to thank you all for your continued support and wish you a very enjoyable summer break.

Quality of Education

This academic year, the Quality of Education Committee has continued to support and challenge school leaders to deliver high quality education and enrichment opportunities that are tailored to meet the needs of the children at St John Fisher.

The development of the curriculum has continued to be a strong focus throughout the year and it has been excellent to see the ambitious curriculum recognised in the recent Ofsted inspection. Subject leaders have continued to be supported through peer support clusters with teachers from other local schools and professional development will continue to be a priority, to maximise the impact of the curriculum for all children.

The new phonics scheme introduced last year, has continued to be embedded in Early Years and is supporting children to develop an early love of reading. Decodable books are supporting children's progress in early years and we are very grateful to the parent volunteers who have been supporting children's reading.

Throughout the school, investment in new books and class resources which align with curriculum and better reflect the diversity of school population, are helping to embed diversity and inclusion, and will help all children feel represented in their learning.

Continued investment in the Talk for Writing and Maths Mastery schemes are providing continued professional development for staff and are supporting the school to deliver against the priorities in the School Development Plan.

We have continued to support and challenge the leadership team to meet the needs of children with SEND which has been in the context of a challenging financial position for the local authority. The school has continued to champion the needs of children with SEND to secure access to specialist support wherever possible, as well as supporting school staff to meet children's individual needs through adaptive teaching.

Additional funding from the Government to support education recovery following Covid has continued to be used to support small group work with children most in need of accelerated progress.

Despite the pressure on school budgets, the school has continued to offer a diverse mix of enrichment activities, including through school visits and clubs, a STEAM week, and a sports fortnight, which continue to be very popular.

Looking forward to the 2023/24 academic year, we expect St John Fisher to continue to build on the implementation of the curriculum and to support the professional development of middle leaders and teachers to deliver high quality teaching and learning.

This year the Quality of Operations Committee has continued to focus on matching the school's expenditure to its financial resources and ensuring that the facilities are compliant and maintained to the best standard possible.

The costs of running the school have reflected some of the wider economic challenges and funding from the Local Authority has also continued to be under pressure. Despite this the school was able to work within its financial resources during the financial year. This was due to the benefit of previous years reserves and continued close financial scrutiny of operational costs.

As in the previous academic year, a significant amount of financial resource has come from the success of using the school facilities to raise income. This is an increasingly essential part of the school finances and in being able to maintain a positive financial balance. This in turn ensures that the school can continue to offer the current high standards of education and facilities. A particular thank you goes to everyone who has been part of making this additional revenue generation a success.

The school has benefitted from several projects to improve the school facilities, notably the Year 5/6 toilet block which is currently undergoing a significant refurbishment.

Going forward the school is looking to continue to operate within the budget constraints of the year ahead and to maintain the excellent facilities the school has. The focus on raising additional income from the school facilities will continue and hopefully with the support of the St John Fisher community.

Spiritual, Ethos and Wellbeing Members: Therese Lord (Chair), Janine Kenna, Fr Matthias, Louisa Asgill, Richard Fisher

The Spiritual, Ethics and Wellbeing committee has continued to support the school during a very full academic year. We congratulate the school body on achieving a very good Ofsted report. The SEW committee are particularly pleased to see the benefits reaped from having a Mental Health lead and the continued work to broaden the scope of Mental Health offers for pupils, parents and staff. Initiatives such as recognising Mental health week in the school with various class activities and assemblies has gone a long way in embedding the importance of mental health as a key factor in the pupils ability to thrive at the school.

The outstanding creation of the Woodland garden has also equipped the pupils with a fantastic space for outdoor learning, reflection and exploration another key factor in maintaining good mental health and wellbeing. A big 'thank you' to all the parents and students who helped to create this space.

The pupils themselves spoke of their school as 'like belonging to a big family where there is always someone who will look after you and make sure you are happy' which can be seen as a testament to all the work that has gone into looking after the mental health of the staff and pupils.

Hot on the heels of the Ofsted inspection, the school now waits in anticipation for the upcoming CSI (Catholic Schools Inspection) which will be under the new framework. There is also a new Catholic Education Directory (curriculum) that needs to be implemented by September 2025

The SEW committee has been briefed on the new assessment criteria and continue to give oversight on the work going into getting the school secure in these requirements. There is a lot of work to be done but the governors are confident that the school leaders have a clear plan of action to attain this.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to welcome two new parent governors to the committee Louisa Asgill and Richard Fisher, they both will bring fresh insight and I am happy that they have chosen to take on this new responsibility.
