This morning pupils and parents enjoyed an Advent themed assembly led by St. Ninian class. The theme was certainly very appropriate given today's date!

Our learning about advent started on Monday this week when we learnt more about the tradition of advent calendars.

The idea of counting down the days to Christmas came from a tradition in Germany in the early nineteenth century. Starting on 1 December, Christian people began to put chalk marks on the doors of their houses. They would continue to put a mark on the door each day until it was Christmas Day. The idea was that each time someone entered the house, they would be reminded that God sent Jesus into the world at Christmas.

Today our learning continued as Year 5 talked about another very popular advent tradition—the advent wreath and the significance of each of the 5 candles around the wreath. We are looking forward to lighting the candles over the coming weeks (or at least those weeks left at school!)

Tomorrow we will celebrate another VERY important advent tradition as we enjoy festive fun at the **SJF Christmas fair.** Thank you so much to all those who have been busy planning for the last months and weeks, and to all those who have formed part of the busy preparation team here at school today. I look forward to seeing you all tomorrow to start our Christmas preparations as a school community together!

We appreciate you may not be able to attend every week but hope to see as many of you as possible.




Travelling Kings
