

This week our pupils celebrated the "European Day of Languages". This special day is celebrated every year on the 26th of September. Now in it's twenty second year, the European Day of Languages was first officially celebrated back in 2002 following the success of the European Year of Languages in 2001. The day is organised jointly by the European Union and the Council of Europe.

The purpose of the European Day of Language is to celebrate both the cultural and linguistic diversity within our school and to encourage and promote language learning at any age.

The children are also encouraged to promote intercultural understanding and to talk about where their families come from and the range of languages spoken and learnt within our community.
